

Tampa Launches "Be Smart, Use Your Cart" Recycling Program

In January, Tampa's solid waste department rolled out the first wave of 95-gallon green recycling carts – a step closer toward realizing a pay-as-you-throw trash system.

The new carts are replacing 14-gallon blue bins residents previously used to store recyclables at the curb as part of the city's new "Be Smart, Use Your Cart" automated recycling program. Tonja Brickhouse, director of the City of Tampa Department of Solid Waste & Environmental Program Management, anticipates the larger carts will help bump up citywide recycling numbers.

"We've studied other municipalities that have automated their recycling collection, and it's been demonstrated that recycling

participation increases significantly," Brickhouse said.

The carts, which are outfitted with radio frequency identification tags, are also an answer to customers' complaints about the blue boxes.

"We've heard our customers' concerns, and are now offering a better way to recycle," Brickhouse said.
"The cart holds more recyclables, reduces litter, and easily rolls to the curb and back. We've even embedded a sticker in the lid to remind residents of what they can and cannot recycle."

The program will be rolled out in phases throughout an 18-month period, starting with the four recycling routes with the highest participation rates in the city. Participation rates are based on a six-month study done by the Department of Solid Waste in 2011.

Collier County Household Hazardous Waste Unique and Innovative Grant Agreement with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection

The Collier County Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Department (SHWMD) is committed to implementing its Integrated Solid Waste Management Strategy (ISWMS) that provides for environmentally sound and cost effective solid waste management services for Collier County. One component of the ISWMS is Environmental Compliance, including managing impacts to the air, soil, water, and wildlife, as well as quality of life impacts to the community through the collection of municipal solid and household hazardous wastes.

The SHWMD staff conducts several neighborhood cleanups annually in conjunction with Code Enforcement and the Collier County Sheriff's Office. The cleanups contribute to a safer environment for the neighborhoods by removing waste, recyclables, and household hazardous wastes.

In June 2011, the SHWMD learned of an innovative grant opportunity from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP). Staff submitted a proposal on July 8. On August 3, the FDEP notified the SHWMD that it planned to award the grant to Collier County. The FDEP sent Collier County the formal contract proposal with budget and project plans on September 12.

The grant funds were used to develop educational tools to

promote Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection and disposal for resident and small business, and to add the collection of HHW to five neighborhood cleanups between November 2011 and June 15, 2012. Staff provided education and outreach





about the proper disposal of HHW to the neighborhood residents prior to the cleanups. Staff also provided education and outreach to small businesses in the area about proper hazardous materials disposal and the county's Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator (CESQG) disposal

services.

Educational tools developed in English, Spanish, and Creole included:

- HHW brochures for distribution to small businesses considered CESQGs
- HHW brochures for distribution to residents in the rural areas of Collier County
- HHW educational magnets (4,500) for distribution to home owners
- An 8-minute educational video targeted to the residential segment
- An educational door hanger that was distributed to residents and businesses prior to each cleanup

Staff also used grant funds to modify an existing trailer used for HHW collections. The trailer was outfitted with a liner, spill kits, racks, and containers. Staff also purchased 100 plastic bags for HHW packing and transport.

Over the course of the five neighborhood cleanups, 356 residents property disposed of HHW, including:

- 784 containers of latex and oil base paint
- 115 gallons of used motor oil
- 82 gallons of corrosives/flammable products
- 90 containers of cleaning products
- 61 pieces of electronics
- 17 lead acid batteries

Removing this waste from the neighborhoods is beneficial not only to the residents of that particular area, but also to all Collier County residents in that the waste was kept from being disposed of in the Collier County Landfill.

Food Waste Composting Goes to School

Across the country, this year's back-to-school season included a growing trend - food waste composting in the cafeteria. From Cambridge, MA, to Bakersfield, CA, schools across the country are initiating programs or extending pilots. Closer to home, the Charleston County, SC, Environmental Management Department continued to strengthen its successful partnership with the Charleston County School District (CCSD) by expanding its Green Schools Program. This school year, with technical program assistance from Kessler Consulting, Inc., the Program is being expanded across 80 schools over a phased in period to include food waste diversion.

The Lambs Elementary School in North Charleston was selected as the first CCSD School to pilot the food waste diversion program. A three-way waste sort collection station was installed in the cafeteria. The new

tiered sorting station provides three (3) separate containers for the collection of food waste, recycling, and trash.

The school's principal, Jarmalar Logan, said "Programs like these help students appreciate where their waste ends up, and it's a simple way that our school can be more sustainable." Approximately 13 CCSD schools are currently participating in the program and eventually 45,000

students will empty their food trays for compost.

The food waste is collected by a local food waste hauler and delivered to the County's award winning Bees Ferry Facility, also a USCC STA Certified facility, to be


