
Recycling Overview

Who Manages Recycling?

- Private companies direct recycling of their materials
- Multiple companies competing to collect and process
- Report to state certified recycling values
- Local governments cannot direct where recycling goes
- Local governments do collect (or contract) most residential








Factors Affecting Recycling

- Evolving and volatile global markets affect pricing
- Advancements in recovery technologies
- Sharing of commodity pricing risk
- Unmanaged material contamination affects all parties
- Florida beyond 2020




Orange County

- Landfill complex
- Three transfer stations
- 2.4 million tons of waste generated annually in county
 - 1 million tons managed by Orange County system
 - 1.4 million tons managed by private landfills in and out of county



Orange County

- Unincorporated 227,000 residential households
- Weekly garbage cart, recycling cart, yard waste, and large item collections
 - 235,000 tons of waste
 - 66,000 tons of recyclables
 - 49,000 tons of yard waste
- Businesses, multifamily residences, and municipalities are not part of program





- BCC adopted an ordinance in June 1990 requiring recycling in Orange County
- MRF began operations in August 1990
 - -Upgrade in 2007
 - -Shut down operation and began transfer in 2017








- What is Needed to Improve Recycling in Orange County?

- Improve quality of residential recyclables collected




Challenges and Opportunities



More than 30% of recyclables are garbage

Recycling rate in Orange County: 38% [DEP] ¹²

Pursuit of a New MRF

- Recycling collection
 - -Dual-stream manual collection (1990 - 2015)
 - Averaged 2,220 tons/month in 2015
 - Very low contamination
 - –Single-stream automated collection (2016 – present)
 - Collecting over 5,000 tons/month
 - Much higher level of contamination



Recent Impacts

- Amended recycling contract to share risk
 - -More loads accepted
- Recycling Quality Improvement Program
 - –More than 70,000 households served so far



Percent of Recycling Loads Accepted
